Red Deer Warehouse Forklift Training Programs - Warehouses could be commercial, retail or industrial facilities. Their function can differ from retailing bulk products to product distribution. Regardless of the kind of warehouse, staff inside warehouse settings must be well trained in safety procedures related to material storage and handling, loading docks, conveyor systems, and forklifts and pallet jacks. Good housekeeping is essential to an orderly and safe warehouse environment.

The loading dock system is usually build into the warehouse at a height from the ground making it easy to move stuff coming in and moving out of the warehouse. Workers will also load and unload merchandise and materials from the ramps and elevated docks. Particular attention must be paid to safety practice throughout this stage. To prevent falls, install yellow striping along the edge of docks and ramps. Pay attention to the area around delivery trucks which are parked at the loading dock, specifically the area between truck and dock. Be certain that truck wheels are chocked while unloading.

To distribute products within the facility, some warehouses utilize a conveyor system. These systems are designed with moving belts and wheels that may pose a pinch point hazard. Keep hair and body parts far away from conveyors to prevent injury. Elevated conveyors pose a danger to staff under if safety nets are absent. Workers need to know how to stop conveyors in the event of emergency. Be aware of the location of off switches and emergency stop buttons. When servicing conveyors, lock out/tag out measures are mandatory.

Forklifts and pallet jacks are designed to move materials all-around the warehouse. Forklift operators are needed to take training and receive certification. Operators of pallet jacks do not require certification, but must be trained about the machine. Training programs instruct operators in the correct methods for lifting objects and moving them to their assigned location. Neither forklifts nor pallet jacks should ever be utilized to transport or lift staff.

To allow for enough room for equipment and people to pass, storage shelving and rack systems help to create an efficient and orderly work space, specially if they are properly braced. Careful and slow placement of good is needed to avoid accidents caused by products falling off the facing aisle. Aisles must be kept clear by storing products flat and inside the shelving units. Pallets are utilized for stacking products. They must be in good condition, and palleted products must be baled or shrink-wrapped, whenever possible.

Personal protective equipment (PPE) should be worn, as appropriate, to protect workers' limbs, heads, hands and feet. Hard hats or bump caps, gloves and steel-toed shoes are common PPE.

Slippery floors which are pocked with dents and pits could present significant dangers, making good housekeeping really important. Warehouse docks and floors should be clear of oil, dirt and debris. The space must be kept clear of boxes, baling supplies and garbage.
