Like for example, a type of equipment operator certification enables students to drive 18 wheeler trucks to be able to transport equipment or goods from one place to another. The daily tasks and responsibilities of a truck driver are probably going to be really different from those of an equipment operator who specializes in using demolition equipment on a construction location.

Jobs by equipment operators are often broken down into 3 categories in order to define the types of jobs for equipment operators. These 3 categories comprise truck driving, crane operation and heavy equipment operation. An equipment operator has to have a license and finish heavy equipment operator classes. Once the required training is completed, an operator could operate these types of heavy equipment effectively and safely.

Heavy equipment operators have daily jobs to complete that depends on their requirements set by their employers and likewise depends on the kind of equipment they are using. For instance, there are some circumstances in which due to the parameters of a particular job, the operator would be required to work during night time rather than during normal day time hours. This can be common in road work conditions or in a location that gets heavy evening and day traffic. One more instance is a truck driver's work routine could vary depending on whether he is transporting objects over hundreds, sometimes even thousands of miles, while shorter hauls may be carried out in a normal work day.
